LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Stingray Students and Families:

The 2020-2021 school year is upon us and students will return to campus August 20th + 21st. While our school might feel and look different for this school year due to COVID-19, we are excited to have our students back here at AC. We want all students and teachers to feel safe and prepared for their return to campus; as a result, we have implemented new operational procedures that comply with CDC recommendations:

*School Hours 7:15 a.m.-2:00 p.m.

It is imperative that students are not dropped off before 6:50.

*Modified Attendance Schedule

For the first four weeks of school, students who have not opted for full-time Duval HomeRoom courses will participate in a hybrid model of face-to-face and online instruction based on the schedule outlined

*9th + 11th grade: 2 days/wk face-to-face classes on Monday and Thursday

*10th + 12th grade: 2 days/wk face-to-face classes on Tuesday and Friday

*Virtual instruction will be provided on remaining days via Duval HomeRoom Teams platform As of now, 5 day a week face-to-face classes will resume on September 14, 2020. We will continue to provide updates if this plan changes.

*Modified Bell Schedule

We will now be on a 7-period day with 50 minute classes.

Health and Safety Precautions

- *Students and staff will be required to have a temperature check before entering the school.
- *Students and staff will be required to wear a mask in common areas and classrooms.
- *Students will maintain social distancing in lunch and in the hallways.

While we may face many unknowns this school year, we do know that student achievement cannot fall behind. It is our goal to create a safe environment where students can achieve great success in academics, athletics, and extracurricular activities.

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

August 20, 2020: 9th + 11th grade August 21, 2020: 10th + 12th grade Students can access their schedule online through the Focus platform as early as August 12th.

If your student needs assistance finding their classroom, please have them locate a staff member in the courtyard.

SIGN IN/SIGN OUT PROCEDURES

Any student that reports to school after the 7:15 bell must report to the Front Office for a tardy. Please see the DCPS Student Progression Plan for examples of excused tardy/absence.

Once students arrive on campus, they may not leave without permission. If a student needs to leave school, a parent or legal guardian must check their student out in the front office. If the student is a driver, the parent or legal guardian can call student services to release the student from the school. Students will not be allowed to leave school the last 30 minutes of school.



TRANSPORTATION

DCPS Transportation Department updates the bus route times and stops at

https://dcps.duvalschools.org/Page/9193 throughout the school year. Parents who will be driving their students to school must enter the north side parking lot. Please follow the cones and avoid dropping your student off in visitors' parking lot. Car riders and student drivers should entered the building on the north side entrance. The bus ramp is located on the south side of the school and parents may not pick up or drop off students in this location.

After-school transportation is available. Students need to report to the bus loading zone. Please see link above for transportation routes.

NEW DCPS POLICY: BUS RIDER REGISTRATION

This year, parents/guardians (not students) must log into their FOCUS account in order to register their students to ride the bus.

Once the parent registers their student as a bus rider, the student will be assigned to a bus in approximately 5-7 business days but no earlier than August 4th. At that time, parents can then sign back into Focus to get the specific bus number, bus stop location, and pick-up time.


Schools are required to report students with 15 or more unexcused absences in a 90-day period to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles for the loss of driving privileges and suspension of license. Any minor who fails to satisfy attendance requirements at school will be ineligible for driving privileges.



PARKING DECALS



TARDY POLICY



A student should make every effort to be in classes on time. An unexcused tardy exists when a student is not in his/her seat when the bell rings. Excessive unexcused tardies will be subject to disciplinary actions. Student drivers with 3 or more tardies to first period in an 9 weeks will have their driving privileges suspended or revoked.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Possession of a wireless communication device is not an infraction of the Code of Student Conduct. However, it is an infraction of the Code of Student Conduct when the possession of a wireless communication device disrupts the educational process. This includes the unauthorized use of a wireless communication devices to capture images or recordings without permission during school hours and/or the unauthorized use on school buses in the absence of an emergency concerning safety-to-life issues (defined as a bus accident, mechanical breakdown which delays the normal route, and/or thirty (30) minutes or more in a route delay). Also, please keep in mind the school is not responsible if your child's phone is lost or stolen.

DRESS CODE POLICY



Students are prohibited from wearing clothing that exposes underwear or body parts in an indecent or vulgar manner or that disrupts the orderly learning environment. The waistband of shorts, slacks, skirts, and similar garments shall not be worn below the hips. Clothing which is not worn appropriately, is not properly fastened, is suggestive, or has tears that reveal or expose body parts, has printing with words or pictures that have a sexual connotation will not be permitted. All trousers, including oversized or low-hanging trousers, must be worn and secured at waist level. Underwear, midriff and back may not be exposed. If belts, suspenders, and straps are worn, they shall be worn in place and fastened.

ATTENDANCE POLICY



If a student has at least five unexcused absences, or absences for which the reasons are unknown, within a calendar month, or 10 unexcused absences, or absences for which the reasons are unknown, within a 90-calendar day period, the student's primary teacher shall report the student's attendance to the principal. The principal shall, unless there is clear evidence that the absences are not a pattern of non-attendance, refer the case to the school level Attendance Intervention Team (AIT). Please see the DCPS Student Progression Plan for more details on the attendance policy.

ATLANTIC COAST ATHLETICS





9TH GRADE ELIGIBILITY

A first-year high school student, entering the 9th grade for the first time, and who was regularly promoted, is academically eligible during his/her first semester of high school attendance. After the 1st semester of 9th grade, the student must have a 2.0 GPA to continue to be eligible.

SCHOLASTIC REQUIREMENTS

A middle/junior high student must have 2.0 GPA, or the equivalent of a 2.0 GPA based on a 4.0 scale, at the conclusion of each semester. A high school student must have a cumulative 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 unweighted scale, or its equivalent, at the conclusion of each semester to be academically eligible during the next semester (§ 1006.15(3)(a)1, F.S.).

Final grades previously earned by the student from another school shall not be converted using the scale in Bylaw 9.4.2.
